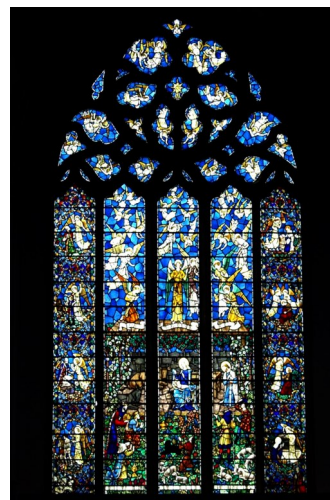
Parent Forum

Uniform

The vast majority of our students arrived for the start of the new academic year looking smart and well prepared for learning in September. If you have any queries about what items are required for the school uniform please consult our website page www.ryecollege.co.uk/parents/uniform that provides full details of the college dress code. A few reminders are shown below to aid parents in terms of the college's expectations:

- Blazers must be worn. Blazers may be taken off in lessons and during break and lunch times.
- Shirts are to be tucked in.
- Ties are to rest on the top button of shirts.
- Black trousers only - black jeans or leggings are not part of the uniform.
- Jewellery - students may wear a pair of studs in their ears. Any other piercings must be a clear plastic retainer only. Jewellery will be confiscated and passed to reception for collection at the end of the college day.
- Make-up - all make up must be discrete, students will be asked to remove it if it is not.
- Mobile phones and headphones may not be used during college hours. Both these items must be placed in a students bag. Headphones and mobiles will be confiscated if seen and handed into reception for collection at the end of the college day.
