Dear Parent

I am writing to you because you have a child who is due to move into Year 10 in September 2018 and to bring to your attention other opportunities for education starting in Y10 available in the local area, of which you may not be aware. The school I am referring to has an uncommon intake to typical 11-16 secondary schools. This does not mean that you should consider moving your child from their existing school if this is still the best option for them, however I am legally required to bring these information to your attention.

You may wish to look into and consider whether your child would want to apply for a place in September 2018.

You should look at the GCSE curriculum at your child's current school, to help consider what the best option is for the next two years of your child's education and strongly recommend that your child discuss their options with a Careers Adviser in their current school or college.

After such discussions, if you consider that a move would be appropriate, we would also advise you to arrange a meeting with a senior member of staff at your child's current school to discuss the options available.

Please be aware that should your child transfer to utc@harbourside, he or she will not be entitled to assistance with home to school transport unless it is the nearest appropriate school to your home address and is over three miles from the family home, or you qualify based on low income grounds – details can be found at eastsussex.gov.uk/schooltransport
